

How to donate:

- **By standing order** – this is a safe and convenient way to make a regular donation to the fund. To set up a standing order please visit the 1% Matters website to download a form to hand in at your bank, please call us on 01623 620 202 for our bank account details. Alternatively you can set up a standing order through your online banking or telephone banking services. When setting up a payment please use 1MF and your surname as payment reference so we can ensure your donation goes to the correct fund (if no reference is used your donation will go into our Major Oak Fund).
- **By cheque** – visit the 1% Matters website to print and complete a gift aid form. Once completed please return it to us (address on the form) together with your cheque made payable to Nottinghamshire Community Foundation, and write 1% Matters Fund on the back of the cheque.
- **By PayPal** – please visit the 1% Matters website for details on how to donate via PayPal (please be aware PayPal take 3.4% + 20p from your donation).
- **By bank transfer** – to transfer directly to our bank call us on 01623 620 202 for our account details.
