Understanding people's attitudes to the Covid-19 vaccine

Fewer people in Nottingham have had their Covid-19 vaccination than in other parts of the country. The number of vaccinated people in our city's diverse communities is lower still.

We want to understand why. We believe vaccination offers the best defence against Covid-19 – and we want to keep people in our city safe.

Nottingham City Council and the NHS are holding a series of workshops with people from our Black Caribbean community and our Chinese community. We want these discussions to look at the different reasons why people might not get vaccinated so we can better understand the key issues and barriers.

We would like the facilitators of these workshops to come from within the communities where uptake is low:

- Black Caribbean
- Chinese

Facilitators will receive training on how to run a discussion group and will be paid £100. Some will be face-to-face discussion

groups, while others will be held virtually on Zoom and MS Teams. Experts from the City Council and the NHS will support throughout.
